

People without citizenship

-In 2014, the total population of the United States was about 314.1 million. About 86.9 percent of people living in the United States were native-born citizens, 6 percent were naturalized citizens, and 7.1 percent were non-citizens.

-In 2019, 44.9 million immigrants (foreign-born individuals) comprised 14 percent of the national population.

Imigration

United States has a larger immigrant population than any other country, with 47 million immigrants as of 2015. This represents 19.1% of the 244 million international migrants worldwide, and 14.4% of the United States population

In 2011, 76 percent of patents from top 10 U.S. patent-producing universities had at least one foreign-born author

States with a high concentration of foreign-born workers experience significantly faster productivity growth.

People being deported

- -During the Presidency of Barack Obama, about 3.2 million people were deported.
- -During the George w. Bush administration about 2.0 million people were deported
- -During the Presidency of Bill Clinton, about 1,870,000 people were deported
